What are Centres of Vocational Excellence?

Vocational Excellence ensures high quality skills and competences that lead to quality jobs and careers, which meet the needs of an innovative, inclusive and sustainable economy.

The initiative on Centres of Vocational Excellence (CoVEs) defines a bottom-up approach to excellence where Vocational Education and Training (VET) institutions rapidly adapt skills provision to societal and economic needs, supporting the green and digital transitions, as well as the post-CoVID recovery.

CoVEs bring together a wide range of local, regional and national partners from different countries, including but not limited to: initial and continuing VET providers, universities of applied sciences and polytechnics, research institutions, companies, chambers, social partners, social enterprises, national and regional authorities, development agencies, employment services, and social inclusion organisations.

Together they co-create "skills ecosystems" that contribute to regional development, innovation, industrial clusters, and smart specialisation strategies, as well as to social inclusion.

They operate in a given local context, closely embedded in innovation ecosystems, while working with centres in other countries through international collaborative networks. CoVEs can play an important bridging role in industrial ecosystems to drive responses to skills imbalances and orienting skills development to the needs of businesses. They also support the diffusion of innovation and applied research, especially among SMEs.

This initiative constitutes a comprehensive approach to Vocational Excellence and introduces a European dimension aimed at fostering "upward convergence" of quality in VET.


