Planning, preparation and paperwork as **part of the course / learning process**

Manage finances and bookings within institution (caretakers)

Use easy to read documents and **<u>dialog</u>** re agreements

Practise new skills beforehand: e.g. change of trains

- Offer support with ideas, communication and structure (travel in small groups)
- Integrate mobility into a course or a common learning goal (e.g. advocacy work)
